They began arriving be-fore sundown, attired in sacongs, aloha shirts, grass skirts, leis, muumus and holomuus and a miscellany of other comfortable out-fits. Revelry struck a tempo and by sundown the party was in full swing, the happy hordes spilling onto the beach singing full voice to t he boisterous sea in which they splashed at intervals in the darkness on the lookout for King Kamehameha in person. Kamehameha, whose appearance was promised over Honolulu's ra-diced message via "Hawaii Calls," failed to appear. 
